

-  **Public Policy Observatory** that is divided into 4 sub-sections: [EU language policies](#), [National language strategies](#), [EU funding opportunities](#), and [National for regional Funding Opportunities](#).
-  **Language Resources Observatory** that will become a one-stop-shop to access (open public and private) language resources based on existing repositories and suggesting new ways to find or access LRs.
-  **Language Market Observatory**: In addition to the [LangTechNews](#) that provide language technology news worldwide, and the [CITIA news](#) on conversational interaction technologies, the new [LangPolNews](#) gives insight into European language and language-related news.
